Subject contents	<p>Students learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>- the alphabet and rules of pronunciation;</li> <li>- courteous expressions to introduce themselves and others, how to greet people and say goodbye, provide information and ask how others feel both formally and informally;</li> <li>- personal pronouns in the nominative case as well as nouns in the definite and indefinite form;</li> <li>- verbs in the present tense to describe daily routines as well as personal interests and hobbies;</li> <li>- simple and inverted syntax in affirmative sentences, negative sentences, questions and short answers;</li> <li>- cardinal numbers as well as phrases used to tell the time, ask about the time, ask about prices or someone's age;</li> <li>- names of the days of the week;</li> <li>- family members and professions;</li> <li>- everyday objects;</li> <li>- rooms of the house and items of furniture;</li> <li>- basic adjectives, names of nationalities;</li> <li>- vocabulary concerning food and doing simple shopping</li> </ul>
