Subject contents	<p>Vocabulary:</p> <p>Exercises applying the knowledge of basic, professional technical terms and phrases. They concern the complex lexical structures such as: physical items, shapes items, word families, key technical terms related to the description of the process. Students practice pronunciation drills.</p> <p>Grammar:</p> <p>Grammar is presented in a simple manner in the primary range. Students learn nouns, adjectives, verbs and their conjugation.</p> <p>Writing:</p> <p>The ability to write is practiced by using a variety of tasks in realistic contexts that reflects the diversity of texts. The tasks of developing writing skills include: curriculum vitae, abstracts, e-mails, descriptions of technical processes.</p> <p>Reading:</p> <p>The range of exercises aim at practising the skills of reading, execute commands and retrieve detailed information.</p> <p>Speaking:</p> <p>Students learn to communicate effectively with future colleagues, instructors and clients. Students are prepared to create and conduct a presentation, administration arguments for and against, asking questions, checking information.</p> <p>Listening:</p> <p>Everyday life and work environment vocabulary are to develop listening skills in different situations. Students learn to listen in order to understand the specific information.</p>
