**Subject contents****Lectures: dr M. Dymnicka**

Introductory lecture. Basic concepts and terminology. Sociology and other disciplines (anthropology, architecture, urban planning). Culture, society, space. Concept of the culture. Areas of cultural regulations. Culture's role in development of the space. Social interactions in urban space. Interactions in time and space. The factors of social change. Phenomenon of globalization and dimensions of globalization. Levels of social life (micro, mezzo, makro). Contemporary society: challenges, dilemmas, problems. New conceptualisation of contemporary society (mobile and risk society etc.). Origins of modern research on the town. Chicago school. Review of theories and trends of urban development. Global economy impact on the development of the metropolis. Metropolitan and creative class. Sociology of the space: place and space. Home as a place. Public space in sociological perspective. Public space private space: common and problematic areas. Revitalization: social aspects. Complexity and multifaceted process. Role of culture and art. Participation of citizens in transforming the urban environment. Summary of the course.

**Exercises**

Introduction of the subject: sociology of the built environment. The beginnings of the contemporary research on the urban issues. Concept of the cultural area and social space. Interaction in the city space. Issues of the sociology of place and space (social creating of the place in the modern urban conditions, the place identity dilemmas: unification-fragmentation, issues of the quasi-place, spaces of consumption, spaces of exclusion, spaces of flow). Impact of globalisation processes on the town development: metropolisation, fragmentarisation, gentrification, spaces of consumption, space and civic society. Renovation of the urban space sociological issues. Social participation in the restoration process of the city.

**Lectures: dr M. Szmytkowska**

Research concepts and schools explaining the social diversity in urban space. Determinants of spatial organization. Social production of space. The concept of place. The concept of social space. Socio-cultural effects of space management. Directions of the evolution of European culture. The cultural landscape. Cultural heritage. Socio-spatial dimensions of the socialist and post-socialist cities. Urbanism and politics.

**Lectures: dr.inż. arch. G. Rembarz**

Subject includes introduction into the problem field of the new residential structures in the contemporary city. Set of lectures and workshops covers basic lines towards understanding of the urban design and function of the new housing areas.
