Subject contents	Introduction to economic law is carried out in the scope of selected issues. In order to properly assimilate knowledge and read legal norms, the lecture introduces basic legal concepts in the field of jurisprudence, in particular information about the sources of law and their interpretation. In the main subject of economic law, the focus is on the regulation of economic activity. The basic concepts defining, among others, enterprise, entrepreneur and his duties, power of attorney and procuracy, organizational and legal forms of running a business as well as familiarized with the basic systems of legalizing business activity, such as the Central Register and Information on Economic Activity and the National Court Register. Selected issues in the field of contracts in trade and consumer protection were also presented.
