Writing: Practicing writing skills for various types of texts: reports, emails, CVs, notes, instructions, and process explanations. Reading: Enhancing reading comprehension skills. Listening: Developing listening skills based on materials presenting situations related to the work environment and everyday life: telephone conversations, interviews, customer service scenarios, lectures, presentations. Speaking: Practicing communication skills in both general and specialized language: presenting arguments, problem-solving, case studies, conducting formal, informal, and interview conversations. Practicing pronunciation and correct word stress.
