Subject objectives	The objective of the course <i>Fundamentals of Legal Knowledge I</i> is to introduce students to the basic concepts, institutions, and principles of the legal system in Poland, with particular emphasis on civil law, property law, the law of obligations, and administrative law and administrative procedure. The course aims to develop students understanding and interpretation of fundamental legal regulations concerning legal entities, legal acts, property relations, contractual agreements, and the functioning of public administration bodies. Additionally, the course familiarizes students with the basics of personal data protection and public procurement law, while developing their ability to apply fundamental legal provisions in practical and professional contexts.
